L: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, who was in the beginning, who makes a dwelling among us, who covers us with justice and mercy. **Amen.**


Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

L: The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the first chapter.




* Prayer After Communion
